



# THOMAS MUNSON FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

## INSTRUCTIONS TO SCHOLARSHIP APPLICANTS

### General Information

The Thomas Munson Foundation Scholarship Fund (TMFSF) provides scholarships that include awards for community or junior college, four-year college or university, graduate education, and a business or nonprofit internship.

Detailed descriptions of all scholarships, including eligibility requirements and performance metrics for renewable scholarships, are given below on pages 7–9.

There is no fee to apply for the TMFSF scholarships.

To apply, you must be a citizen of the United States and must be able to trace your ancestry to Thomas Munson or another original settler of the colony at New Haven, Connecticut, in 1639. Information about documenting your descent lineage and a complete list of all original settlers is given below on pages 10–11.

As an applicant, you are solely responsible for ensuring that all application materials are postmarked on or before the deadline of March 1 in the award year. Send your materials to the following address:

**The deadline for application materials is March 1. Applications  
and materials that are postmarked  
on or after March 2 will not be considered.**

Scholarship Awards Committee does not provide confirmation that your application materials were delivered. It is strongly recommended that, at the time of mailing, you use a United States

Postal Service (USPS) delivery option that tracks your package and/or provides a means of delivery confirmation. Be aware that FedEx and UPS do not deliver to USPS mailbox addresses, so do not attempt to use them.

Each applicant must ensure that all required academic institution documents/transcripts and letters of recommendation are postmarked by the March 1 deadline. Be vigilant and insistent, and make timely inquiries with the school(s) and individuals from whom you request documents and letters so that they send the materials to the committee by the deadline date.

**Applications and materials postmarked on or after March 2 will not be considered.**

Decisions of the Scholarship Awards Committee are final.

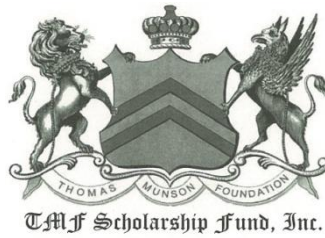

Decision letters are mailed to applicants in the spring. If you are awarded a scholarship, our treasurer will verify your enrollment at your chosen academic institution and then send the scholarship funds directly to the institution. They will be credited to your account there.

## To Assemble Your Application Package

- 1) Complete the Application Form that follows. All questions must be answered and essays written, including the Motor Vehicles List, Personal Statement, and Historical Context Question.
- 2) Include a copy of your Student Aid Report (SAR), which summarizes the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Do not send the entire FAFSA report.
- 3) Arrange to have the following documents sent to Ms. Jill Hunting, Chairperson, Scholarship Awards Committee, P. O. Box 41347, Los Angeles, CA 90041. The documents must be sent directly from original sources, not by the applicant.
  - Two letters of recommendation: one from a school official (classroom teacher, counselor, faculty member, faculty advisor, or institution administrator); and one from a non-family community member.
  - An official copy of your high school and college transcript(s), depending on scholarship type. Transcripts should name the courses completed and grades earned, including mid-term grades for the current scholastic year.
4. Instructions for submitting evidence of ancestry and a list of the signatories are given on pages 10–11 below.

- Thomas Munson left the known world of England for a new life in what would become the United States. In what way have you taken a chance or tried something new to achieve a goal that is important to you?

# SCHOLARSHIP DESCRIPTIONS

## 1. One 2-Year Community or Junior College Renewable Scholarship (\$2,500)

**Purpose:** To help pay the costs of community or junior college. “Community or Junior College” includes accredited U.S. community and junior colleges, but not career, technical, vocational, or trade schools.

**Eligibility:** An applicant must be able to trace his or her ancestry to Thomas Munson or another original settler of the colony at New Haven, Connecticut, in 1639. Applicants must be applying to enter a 2-year community or junior college program of any major or discipline at an accredited community college.

**Target applicants:** Motivated individuals of any age who wish to pursue higher education and who will complete the degree within the continuous 2-year time frame.

**Amount:** \$2,500/year with second-year renewal based on performance metrics. Renewability will be evaluated based on performance metrics as well as the awardee’s demonstrated commitment to achieving his/her academic goals.

**Renewal performance metrics:** 1) Achieve cumulative 3.0 GPA for the first year, as verified by an official transcript sent to the Scholarship Awards Committee Chairperson by July 1 following Spring Semester completion. If awardee falls below the 3.0 GPA threshold, he/she has 1 semester grace period to raise the cumulative GPA back to 3.0. Otherwise the scholarship is forfeited. 2) Submit a written report to the Scholarship Awards Committee Chairperson also by July 1 following Spring Semester completion that a) details, in 100 to 150 words, the awardee’s academic accomplishments, b) explains, in 100 to 150 words, the awardee’s positive personal growth experiences for the first year, and c) describes, in 100 to 150 words, the awardee’s career path and job opportunity targets and/or offers received based on program achievements. Failure to progress toward the degree within the time frame will be taken into consideration by reviewers in deciding whether to renew the award.

**Deadline:** March 1

A hard copy of the completed application must be sent via U.S. mail to the Scholarship Awards Committee Chairperson. Applications are not accepted electronically.

## 2. Three 4-Year College or University Renewable Scholarships (\$5,000)

**Purpose:** To help students pay for college or university.

**Eligibility:** An applicant must be able to trace his or her ancestry to Thomas Munson or another original settler of the colony at New Haven, Connecticut, in 1639. Applicants must be applying to enter a 4-year program of any major or discipline at an accredited college or university. Applicants can be current high

school seniors, undergraduate freshmen, sophomores, or juniors enrolled in any undergraduate major of an accredited 4-year college or university; these applicants may apply for renewable annual awards for their remaining program years.

**Target applicants:** Motivated individuals of any age who wish to pursue higher education and who will complete the degree within the continuous 4-year time frame.

**Amount:** \$5,000/year with second- to fourth-year renewals based on performance metrics. Renewability will be evaluated based on performance metrics as well as the awardee's demonstrated commitment to achieving his/her academic goals.

**Renewal performance metrics:** 1) Achieve cumulative 3.0 GPA for each scholarship award year, as verified by an official transcript sent to the Scholarship Awards Committee Chairperson by July 1 following Spring Semester completion. If awardee falls below the 3.0 GPA threshold, he/she has 1 semester grace period to raise the cumulative GPA back to 3.0. Otherwise the scholarship is forfeited. 2) submit a written report to the Awards Committee Chairperson also by July 1 following Spring Semester completion that a) details, in 100 to 150 words, your academic accomplishments for the year, b) illustrates, in 100 to 150 words, at least one academic goal you achieved in your major that will further your career opportunities, and c) explains, in 100 to 150 words, one or more positive personal growth experiences for the award year. For the final renewal year, the written report must describe how you will seek and secure employment in your chosen career or what your next life steps will be upon completion of the undergraduate program. If you have secured employment before graduation, include in your final scholarship report where you will be working and what your job activities and responsibilities will be. Failure to progress toward the degree within the time frame will be taken into consideration by reviewers in deciding whether to renew the award.

**Number of awards:** 3

**Deadline:** March 1

**How to apply:** The application process and materials can be found online at <http://www.thomasmunson.org/wp-content/uploads/2017/12/2018-TMF-scholarship-application.pdf>. A hard copy of the completed application must be sent via U.S. mail to the Scholarship Awards Committee Chairperson. Applications are not accepted electronically.

### 3. One Graduate Program Scholarship (\$5,000)

**Purpose:** To help a student pay for graduate school.

**Eligibility:** An applicant must be able to trace his or her ancestry to Thomas Munson or another original settler of the colony at New Haven, Connecticut, in 1639. Applicants must be graduating college seniors or college/university-graduated individuals applying to enter an accredited Masters or Doctorate graduate program of any major or discipline at an accredited college or university. This award is not renewable.

**Target applicants:** Graduating college/university seniors or individuals with a completed undergraduate degree from an accredited college or university.



**Amount:** \$5,000

**Number of awards:** 1

**Deadline:** March 1

**How to apply:** The application process and materials can be found online at <mailto:http://www.thomasmunson.org/wp-content/uploads/2017/12/2018-TMF-scholarship-application.pdf>. A hard copy of the completed application must be sent via U.S. mail to the Scholarship Awards Committee Chairperson. Applications are not accepted electronically.

#### 4. One Business or Nonprofit Internship Scholarship (\$2,000)

**Purpose:** To help students pay for living expenses during an unpaid business or nonprofit internship.

**Eligibility:** An applicant must be able to trace his or her ancestry to Thomas Munson or another original settler of the colony at New Haven, Connecticut, in 1639. An applicant must either be enrolled in, or a graduate of, an educational program of any major or discipline in an accredited high school, vocational school, community or junior college, 4-year college/university, or graduate school. The applicant must provide proof of either having an internship offer in hand or currently working in an internship at the time of application. This award is not renewable.

**Target applicants:** Enrolled or graduated high school, community or junior college, 4-year college/university, and graduate students in any major at an accredited college or university.

**Amount:** \$2,000

**Number of awards:** 1

**Deadline:** March 1

**How to apply:** The application process and materials can be found online at <mailto:http://www.thomasmunson.org/wp-content/uploads/2017/12/2018-TMF-scholarship-application.pdf>. A hard copy of the completed application must be sent via U.S. mail to the Scholarship Awards Committee Chairperson. Applications are not accepted electronically.



## DOCUMENTING YOUR DESCENT FROM A SIGNER OF THE 1639 NEW HAVEN COMPACT

You do not need to be descended from Thomas Munson or related to a member of the Thomas Munson Foundation to apply for a scholarship.

### **Descent from Thomas Munson:**

To document your descent from Thomas Munson, begin your research well in advance of the application deadline. If you are already registered in the database of Thomas Munson descendants and/or The Munson Record, enter your RN number and clan name on the application. No further documentation is needed. If you are not already registered or do not know if you are registered, send with your application (1) a copy of your birth certificate and (2) documentation that proves your descent from a branch of the Thomas Munson family tree. If you do not already have documentation, try Google searches or look for the information on a genealogy website. Many public libraries allow patrons to access genealogy sites at no charge. Submit this documentation with your application, along with a copy of your birth certificate. We may ask you to provide additional information.

### **Descent from another signer of the 1639 New Haven compact:**

If you are descended from a signer of the 1639 FUNDAMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR GOVERNANCE OF NEW HAVEN COLONY other than Thomas Munson, you are eligible to apply for a scholarship, provided you document your descent from your ancestor, send a copy of your birth certificate, and meet all the other application criteria.
